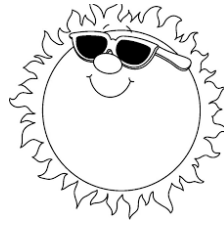

Applications for SAFETY TOWN 2025 are available at the St. Ann Police Department (10405 St. Charles Rock Road) and must be received by July 10, 2025, at 4:00 p.m.

The dates for Safety Town are July 14 through July 25 (Monday through Friday).
Time: 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m.

Children ages 5-11 years of age are welcome to attend Safety Town at Drummond Elementary School (3721 St. Bridget Lane).

The children will learn about:

Car, Bus, and Bicycle Safety in addition to Playground, Pool/Water, Fire Safety and Eddie the Eagle will teach Gun Safety.

Dispatchers will show children what happens when 9-1-1 is called during an emergency.

Animal Safety, along with sign and signal recognition, will also be taught.

The cost per child is \$30. Cash or Money Order, payable to St. Ann Police Department. Space is limited. Please include "Safety Town" on the memo line.

ST. ANN ANIMAL CONTROL

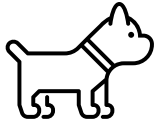
Sage Uebinger is our Animal Control Officer, and she is very busy with animal concerns. St. Ann has ordinances regarding pets in order to keep our residents and guests to the city safe. We have leash laws, laws regarding vaccines, and a requirement that you pets are registered with the city. **Please have your pets microchipped. If a pet gets out, we can locate the owner quickly if the pet is chipped.**

If you have an issue with your pet(s) or wild animals (that isn't an emergency), please call 427-8000 ext. 1. If you have an emergency with an animal, it is no different than any other emergency, CALL 9-1-1.

St. Animal Pet Adoptions is in desperate need of volunteers.

Please help with the dogs at our shelter. Responsibilities would include feeding the dogs, cleaning the kennels, as well as walking and playing with the dogs. Volunteers must be at least 18+ years old. Shifts needs:

Saturday Mornings at 9:00 a.m., Saturday Evenings at 7:30 p.m.,
Sunday Mornings at 9:00 a.m., and Sunday evenings at 7:30 p.m.

FOR EMERGENCIES 9-1-1 continue to be used!

To get started, TEXT Hi to 314-271-2444 for example, your message could say one word and if the website has the information, you will get a response in the form of a text message on your phone. If you use a word that isn't found on the city's website, the system will let you know that it wasn't able to locate the answer and it will forward your phone number to one of the administrators of the program who will call you.

Many cities are using this program. It is a way to communicate with the city.
