

Dear St. Ann Community,

As I write this, the nation is in the midst of the COVID-19 Pandemic. Public safety and the health and well-being of our residents and City employees is our top priority. The St. Louis County Executive has issued a “Stay-at-Home” order for non-essential individuals. Please know that the City of St. Ann will continue to provide essential services, doing whatever we can to help, while also following this order to continue protecting our community. Such actions include the Police Department separating itself into two geographically segregated units. The City has closed the Community Center and Pool and has cancelled meetings and events to minimize the exposure to residents and employees.

Unfortunately, we have had to discontinue the Senior Van service. We cannot put our staff and riders at risk in such a small enclosed space. If you need a ride, Metro Call-A-Ride is still functioning and can be reached at 314-652-3917. Our City staff has been working vigorously to ensure that our residents are able to get essential items. Employees from the Community Center, Building Department and Police Department are working together and will be available to deliver essential items which include food and medication to St. Ann residents starting March 23, 2020. Residents will be responsible for payments of these items. If you or someone you know is unable to get these essential items, please call the St. Ann Community Center at 314-429-4545 for more information. Also, Meals on Wheels is an option. It is important that we all have correct and accurate information and do not rely on rumors and misinformation. Please remember to check in on your neighbors by phone, particularly the elderly. There are many residents who don’t have the resources to stay updated. So please keep them in mind.
